A new sculpture for the Island of Fuerteventura has been made by the Principal of Hampstead School of Art, the sculptor Isabel H Langtry.

The sculpture made of corten steel is named 'Morphini'. Its forms & spaces, its movement & dynamics inspired by the Fuerteventura butterfly shapes of that name.

Isabel says "it was a pleasure to work on this extraordinary island whose beauty has been shaped by volcanoes, wind and sea, and to have the opportunity to work with one of their leading sculptors Juan Miguel Cubas. Pedro Armas Romero - Mayor of Pajera, who visited and praised the new public sculpture will be visiting Camden and Hampstead School of Art this month along with the curator and art writer Marta Patallo. They will be visiting a new exhibition at HSoA Gallery of paintings by Alan Gouk who together with Sir Frank Bowling, Francisco Gazitua MRSS, Dolorosa Sinaga and Lady Rachel Scott Bowling are Patrons of the local art school.

This is Isabel's ninth public sculpture now installed around the world, following in the footsteps' of fellow Camden sculptors Anthony Caro and Phillip King.

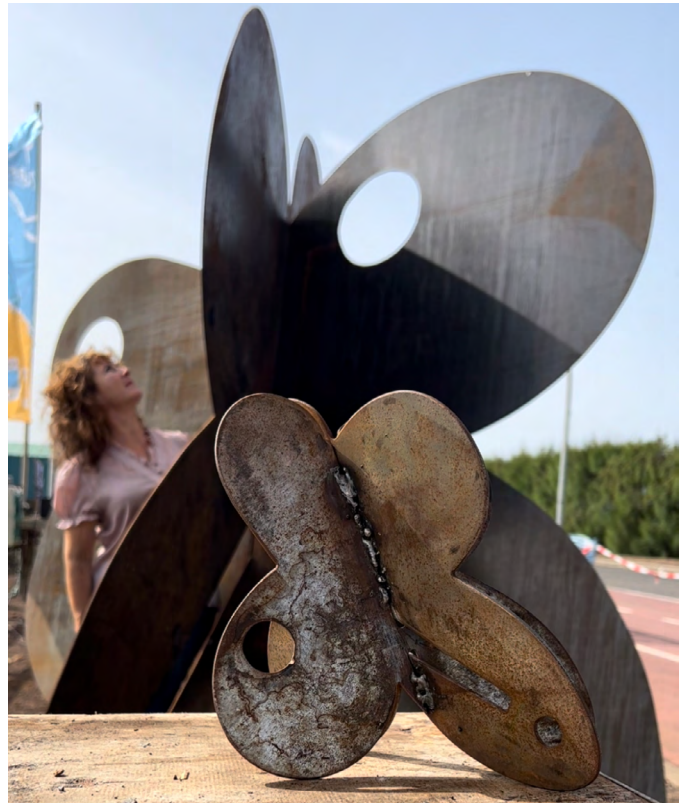
